A day in the life of an Early Childhood Special Educator (EEE) is always busy! Each is chock-full of teaching, meetings and paperwork responsibilities. Managing it all (and still finding time for lunch) can sometimes feel like a daunting task! This becomes even more complex for those working in multiple settings and teams.

This workshop will focus on sharpening your skills & adding to your toolbox as we walk through the special education process. It will offer organizational tools & strategies related to each step so as to maximize your time and energy. We will discuss the daily operations and responsibilities of being a preschool case manager/service provider and brainstorm cost-effective, time-smart approaches. A "**make & take**" session will also be included for creating materials that you can start using your next day at work.

During this workshop we will focus on:

- Supports to guide you through the Early Childhood Special Education evaluation, placement and IEP processes
- Strategies for being most effective with lesson planning time & data collection
- Logistics of case management responsibilities such as facilitating meetings, reporting progress, planning transitions, communicating with families, etc.
- Tools to assist your role of supporting & consulting with paraprofessionals
