 Connecting the Dots: Using Best Practices to Support Young Children and their Families

A Workshop Series/Course Opportunity for Early Childhood

It's an exciting time in early childhood education! Our work is guided by new Vermont Early Learning Standards (VELS), new Head Start standards, and new professional standards and competencies. We have access to many resources, including Strengthening Families framework, Early Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS), the Pyramid model, as well as CLASS and TS GOLD assessments. Sometimes it can feel overwhelming.

To help understand and integrate these elements into a body of best practices to support young children and their families, the Vermont Higher Education Collaborative is offering a two-year series of interactive workshops for early childhood professionals. Year One (2016-2017) will focus on children ages 3-5, and the Year Two (2017-2018) will focus on supporting infants and toddlers. Each series consists of four days of interactive, integrated learning experiences that blend theory and practice. Taken as a set, these four workshops will also be available for 3 graduate or undergraduate credits with Lyndon State College.
