Advocates for Youth - Rights, Respect, Responsibility: A K-12 Sexuality Curriculum
Sexual health education is one vital component of a planned, ongoing and systematic health education program. This training will provide participants with strategies and resources to develop the comfort, knowledge, and core skills needed to deliver developmentally appropriate sexual health education to students in grades K-12.

By the end of this workshop, participants will be able to:

1. Describe three important elements that contribute to a safe learning environment when teaching about sexuality in school.
2. Practice at least one interactive teaching strategy that is effective when teaching school-age youth about sexuality.
3. Demonstrate their ability to respond to students' questions about sexuality free of their personal values and beliefs.
4. Explain the value of helping students understand when and where youth can access sexual health services.

In addition to the workshop outcomes, participants in the 1-credit course will:

Apply their learning to design an instructional plan for sexuality, specific to their learners and context, which they can then implement back at their school or district
