



• **Assessing and Addressing the Complex Educational Needs of Middle and High School Learners** •

Audience: *Middle and high school special education teachers, general education teachers, and administrators who support them in working with students with more complex profiles, including: students with autism spectrum disorders, intellectual disabilities, and physical disabilities.*

Students who have complex needs, including cognitive, academic, motor, social-emotional, and/or behavioral impairments, often present as puzzles to educators. Conducting assessments that are informative and will guide instruction, as well as delivering programming that appropriately meets the needs of students, is often challenging to even the most invested educators. This workshop series will provide dynamic learning opportunities and discussion of research-based methodologies to better understand each learner's areas of strength and weakness. Each workshop will focus on one domain:

Workshop #1	February 8, 2019	Cognitive/Academic Skills
Workshop #2	March 8, 2019	Behavioral Functioning
Workshop #3	April 4, 2019	Social-Emotional Competencies

During each of the workshop days, participants will learn how to:

- Choose what is important to assess within the targeted domain
- Select appropriate evaluation instruments
- Modify assessment, as necessary, to capture the important information
- Use information obtained to drive instruction and intervention

Participants can attend any or all of the workshops in the series.
